The Centre international d'apprentissage du français at the Shippagan Campus of the Université de Moncton, will open its doors this summer. Although its primary objective is to provide French language training for students from abroad, the Centre will be offering a number of camps during the summer.

One of these camps is an intensive immersion week for High School students (grades 9 – 12), which will take place from July 2 to July 7, 2001. Entitled **Discovering the Acadian Peninsula**, the week's activities are designed to provide participants with the occasion to discover the Acadian Peninsula and to discuss their research. In addition, the week provides participants with the occasion to use their French in an area where that language is almost exclusively the language of communication. Although some time will be spent in class working on projects to improve participants' French, the week is meant to provide hands-on experiences of life in the Acadian Peninsula, with each day having a different theme.

Students will be housed in supervised University accommodation. 5 qualified monitors will be available 24 hours a day. Participants will be expected to arrive on Sunday, July 1, in the evening, and be expected to leave on Saturday, July 7, after lunch.

Activities include:

- A visit to the Village historique acadien, Caraquet
- A visit to a peat farm
- A day exploring the fishing industry
- Theatrical activities
- Musical activities
- Sports activities (evenings at the beach, volleyball, etc)

July 1: Evening arrival, supper
July 2: Visit to a peat farm
July 3: Theatrical activities
July 4: Exploring the fishing industry
July 5: Musical Day
July 6: Village Historique acadien
July 7: Morning wrap up, lunch and departure

Please note that, where possible, students will participate in hands-on activities at the various sites. Time will be spent each day discussing the activities and providing input to participants' command of French (written and oral).

A detailed schedule will be mailed to applicants.

The team of teachers and monitors will ensure that your stay is a profitable and an enjoyable one! Transportation to all activities will be provided by the Centre, using a wheel-chair accessible bus.
